Weedon Bec Village Hall

Our Village Hall is a wonderful and very versatile space and has two sections that are available for hire separately or as a whole:

Annexe: Suitable for meetings of up to approximately 30 people, or small groups or organisations that require a quiet and light space to gather. The annexe has recently been fitted out with new LED lighting and a peripheral power system incorporating computer points which would make a good venue for IT training. There is a small kitchen area alongside the annexe room with a kettle and fridge. Also easy access to a disabled toilet for Annexe users.

Main Hall: Includes a stage area, kitchen, bar and toilet facilities. The Hall is suitable for a variety of functions including wedding receptions, a special birthday or even Village occasions. It is also very popular for dog shows. The Hall can accommodate approximately 120 people.

Tables and chairs are available. The hall holds a premises licence so please enquire if your event requires a bar. WIFI is also available.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES AND PRIZES

Prize values: 1st Prize £1.00, 2nd Prize 50p, 3rd Prize 25p

The second prize for any class will only be awarded if there are three or more entries in that class, third prizes will be at the judges' discretion.

Cups to be awarded:

Cups will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in each section and in the show overall. The Community Cup will be given to the winner of Class 15. The Bruce Nichols Cup will be awarded to the winner of Class 22 (Dahlias). A rose bowl will be awarded to the winner of class 25. The People's Choice cups will be awarded to the entry from classes 62-65 (Adults) and classes 3, 7 & 12 (Children) that win the public vote.

Entry fees: Adult Classes 50p per item entered; Children's Classes (numbered 1-15) are FREE TO ENTER

Entries will be accepted in the classes shown. Please complete the enclosed entry form, and return it, in a sealed envelope, together with the entry fee to Zoe O'Toole, 46 Fusilier Way, Sue Halkett, 16 St Mary's Way or hand your entries in (in a sealed envelope) at Blades during opening hours (please be aware of the 2 steps up to Blades) by:

Do not submit exhibits with entry forms. All exhibits must be brought to the Village Hall on the day of the show.

On Saturday 12th September the Village Hall will be open to exhibitors from 9.30 am. All exhibits must be in place, and all exhibitors must have left the hall by 11 am so that judging can take place between 11 am and 12 noon. Exhibits must not be removed until after the prize-giving at 4.00 pm. Please note that the judges' decision is FINAL.

RULES

1. All exhibits in sections C&D must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been grown by him/her for at least 2 months before the show.
2. All entry forms must be received by those named no later than Thursday 9th September together with the entry fee. Due to difficulties of staging exhibits this rule will be strictly enforced.
3. Exhibits must be brought to the Village Hall and staged before 11.00 am on the day of the show. All exhibitors must leave the hall by 11.00 am.
4. Exhibitors must provide vases etc. The show will provide tables.
5. The show will accept no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to exhibits or the property of exhibitors.
6. The judges decision is final. Prizes will be awarded at 4.00 pm.
7. THERE IS A MAXIMUM OF 2 ENTRIES PER PERSON PER CLASS.
8. Items which have won a prize in previous Weedon shows MAY NOT be exhibited again.

Recipe for Class 48

Walnut Scones

225g self raising flour

1 tsp baking powder

Salt

50g butter

50g chopped walnuts + 6 walnut halves for decoration

125-150ml whole milk

1 egg, beaten

Method

1. Heat oven to 220 degrees, 200 for a fan oven or gas mark 7. Lightly dust a baking sheet with flour.
2. Mix the flour, baking powder and a pinch of salt in a bowl. Add the butter and rub in.
3. Add the chopped walnuts and milk and mix until clumping together.
4. Tip onto work surface and squash into a ball.
5. Flatten the dough and make a disk roughly 3cm thick.
6. Cut into 6 triangles, brush with beaten egg and top with a walnut half.
7. Bake for 15 minutes until golden and puffed

Children's Community Cup

The Parish Council continue to sponsor the Community Cup for a children's class. This year the category is a photograph of a Weedon scene (Class 15)

Artwork - Best in Show

Weedon & District Art Group sponsor the Best in Show award, as chosen by the members of the public. There is an adults and children's prize for the best artwork voted for by residents from categories 62-65 (Adults) and 3, 7 and 12 (Children).

CHILDREN'S ENTRY CLASSES

Children's classes are divided into three age groups:

A. 7 years and under **B.** 8-10 years **C.** 11-14 years

In the children's classes, the age of the competitor is shown on the entry ticket. The judge looks for quality of items that are appropriate to the child's age. The judge will generally rate items with no evidence of adult assistance more highly. A People's Choice cup will be awarded to the owner of the picture which receives the most votes, from classes 3, 7 and 12.

Section A – Children's (7 years and under)

1. A model monster using any materials
2. Six fairy or cup-cakes decorated as you wish
3. A finger or hand-print picture
4. An item of jewellery (this could be pasta shapes, beads etc)

Section B – Children's (8 - 10 years)

5. A model using any materials (this could be clay, cardboard etc)
6. Six fairy or cup-cakes decorated as you wish
7. A painting or drawing—theme Beautiful Weedon
8. Any item of needlework (this could be knitting, sewing etc)
9. A poem or short story of no more than 20 lines

Section C—Children's (11-14 years)

10. A model using any materials (this could be clay, cardboard etc)
11. Six fairy or cup-cakes decorated as you wish
12. A painting or drawing—theme Beautiful Weedon
13. Any item of needlework (this could be knitting, sewing etc)
14. A poem or short story of no more than 20 lines

15. A photograph of a Weedon scene.

ADULT ENTRY CLASSES

Section C. Flowers

Specimens should be blemish free and even in shape. The single rose should be just out of the bud, 4 matching dahlias will be judged more highly than a selection of different ones, and the vase of homegrown flowers should contain as many different varieties as possible. **Check the sizes of entries to class 25 carefully.**

16. House plant – flowering
17. House plant – foliage
18. A pot plant – cactus or succulent
19. A fuschia plant in flower
20. A single rose
21. A vase of 3 hydrangeas

22. A vase of 4 dahlias
23. A vase of homegrown flowers
24. A vase of home-grown garden foliage (no flowers)
25. A miniature flower arrangement (no more than 6 inches in any direction)

Section D. Vegetables and Fruit

Specimens should be clean, free from blemishes and even in shape – where several specimens are requested these should be the same size. Onions should have their outer layers of skin on, and tomatoes should have the green ‘calyx’ where the fruit joins on to the plant, still present. Please do not polish apples.

26. Five pods of runner beans
27. Longest runner beans
27. Three tomatoes
28. Three carrots

31. Specimen vegetable(s) - other than above (one variety only)
32. A plate of mixed vegetables (maximum size 12 inches in diameter)

Section E. Culinary

Jams, chutneys and marmalades should be in clear glass jars **with new lids or cellophane/wax discs as appropriate**. Make sure you follow the size instructions for classes 42 and 43. Items should not be decorated.

40. One jar homemade fruit curd
41. One jar homemade chutney (cooked)
42. Fruit cake made in a 7 or 8 inch tin
43. Victoria sponge cake made in a 7 or 8 inch tin

Section F. Handicrafts (1)

Please state size on entry form for classes 50-54

In the craft classes the judge considers neatness, the quality of the finish and the degree of difficulty. The judge will also take into account the originality of the design. In the written classes the judge looks for originality of thought and phrase, with grammar also being considered. A new class has been introduced to replace the poem and short stories (61 A limerick). A limerick is a, five lined poem that rhymes.

68. Photography – Landscape (max size 8”x 6” including mount)
