Weedon Bec Village Hall

Our Village Hall is a wonderful and very versatile space and has two sections that are available for hire separately or as a whole:

Annexe: Suitable for meetings of up to approximately 30 people, or small groups or organisations that require a quiet and light space to gather. The annexe has recently been fitted out with new LED lighting and a peripheral power system incorporating computer points which would make a good venue for IT training. The area is kitted out with computer outlets. There is a small kitchen area alongside the annexe room with a kettle and fridge. Also easy access to a disabled toilet for Annexe users.

Main Hall: Includes a stage area, kitchen, bar and toilet facilities. The Hall is suitable for a variety of functions including wedding receptions, a special birthday or even Village occasions. It is also very popular for dog shows. The Hall can accommodate approximately 120 people.

Tables and chairs are available. The hall holds a premises licence so please enquire if your event requires a bar. WIFI is also available.

This schedule should give you all the information you need, but please read it carefully and follow the instructions given. Remember the show is for your enjoyment!

Recipe for Class 43 (recipe makes 12—only 6 needed)

RASPBERRY BUNS

75g butter
75g sugar
225g self raising flour
1 pinch salt
3 tbsp milk
1 egg
Raspberry jam
Egg glaze
Sugar for dusting

1. Preheat oven to 200c /gas 6. Prepare baking tray.
2. Rub dry ingredients with butter and mix sugar in afterwards.
3. Add beaten egg and milk, mixing to a stiff consistency.
4. Divide into 12 pieces and shape into balls.
5. Make a well in the centre of each, add jam and seal the tops to form a bun.
6. Egg wash the tops and sprinkle with sugar.
7. Place the buns onto the baking tray leaving room for spreading. Bake to a golden brown for 15—20 minutes.

Children's Community Cup

The Parish Council continue to sponsor the Community Cup for a children's class. This year the category is to design a flag for Weedon. Details are given in Class 11.

Artwork - Best in Show

Weedon & District Art Group sponsor the Best in Show award, as chosen by the members of the public. There is an adults and children's prize for the best artwork voted for by residents from categories 56-59 (Adults) and 3 and 8 (Children).

CHILDREN'S ENTRY CLASSES

Children's classes are divided into two age groups:

- A. 7 years and under
- B. 8-14 years

In the children's classes, the age of the competitor is shown on the entry ticket. The judge looks for quality of items that are appropriate to the child's age. The judge will generally rate items with no evidence of adult assistance more highly. A People's Choice cup will be awarded to the entry from classes 3 and 8, receiving the most votes.

Section A – Children's (7 years and under)

1. An ornament created from natural materials
2. Six fairy or cup-cakes decorated as you wish
3. A painting or drawing
4. A handmade greeting card
5. A poem of no more than 20 lines

Section B – Children's (8 - 14 years)

6. An ornament created from natural materials
7. Six fairy or cup-cakes decorated as you wish
8. A painting or drawing
9. A handmade greeting card
10. A poem of no more than 20 lines

Community Cup

11. Design a flag for the village. Draw a picture of a what Weedon means to you. Take into account what you like best about the village and what the village represents

ADULT ENTRY CLASSES

Section C. Flowers

Specimens should be blemish free and even in shape. The single rose should be just out of the bud, 4 matching dahlias will be judged more highly than a selection of different ones, and the vase of homegrown flowers should contain as many different varieties as possible. **Check the sizes of entries to class 20 carefully.**

12. House plant – flowering
13. House plant – foliage
14. A pot plant – cactus or succulent
15. A fuschia plant in flower
16. A single rose
17. A vase of 4 dahlias
18. A vase of homegrown flowers
19. A vase of home-grown garden foliage (no flowers)
20. A miniature flower arrangement (no more than 6 inches in any direction)

Section D. Vegetables and Fruit

Specimens should be clean, free from blemishes and even in shape – where several specimens are requested these should be the same size. Onions should have their outer layers of skin on, and tomatoes should have the green ‘calyx’ where the fruit joins on to the plant, still present. Please do not polish apples.

21. Five pods of runner beans
22. Longest runner bean
23. Three tomatoes
24. Three carrots
25. Three onions
26. Three potatoes
27. Specimen vegetable(s) - other than above (one variety only)
28. A plate of mixed vegetables (maximum size 12 inches in diameter)
29. Heaviest Marrow (will be judged purely on weight)
30. Funniest misshapen vegetable
31. Three desert apples
32. Three cooking apples
33. Specimen fruit – other than above (one variety only)

Section E. Culinary

Jams, chutneys and marmalades should be in clear glass jars **with new lids or cellophane/wax discs as appropriate**. Make sure you follow the size instructions for classes 37 and 38. Items should not be decorated.

34. One jar of homemade jam - any kind made this year
35. One jar homemade fruit curd
36. One jar homemade chutney (cooked)
37. Fruit cake made in a 7 or 8 inch tin
38. Victoria sponge cake made in a 7 or 8 inch tin
39. MALE ENTRANTS ONLY - 6 plain or fruit scones
40. 6 flapjacks any recipe
41. Homemade bread own recipe (not made in a bread-maker)
42. Six individual shortbread biscuits
43. Technical Baking. 6 Raspberry Buns made using the recipe provided

Section F. Handicrafts (1)

Please state size on entry form for classes 44-53

In the craft classes the judge considers neatness, the quality of the finish and the degree of difficulty. The judge will also take into account the originality of the design. In the written classes the judge looks for originality of thought and phrase, with grammar also being considered.

44. A piece of embroidery or cross stitch
45. A piece of tapestry
46. An item of knitted clothing
47. Knitted items (excluding clothing)
48. A piece of crochet
49. A greetings card (not sewn)
50. An item of sewing/patchwork
51. An item of woodwork
52. Model making – any medium
53. Any item of craftwork
54. A poem (to fit on a single sheet of A4 paper)
55. A coffee break short story (to fit on a single sheet of A4 paper)

Section G – Handicrafts (2)

The judges in these classes consider the artistic qualities, originality and technique. The People’s Choice award will be presented to artist with the highest votes given to a painting in classes 56 to 59.

56. A painting or drawing – portraiture (people) (please state size)
57. A painting or drawing – landscape (please state size)
58. A painting or drawing – animals and birds (please state size)
59. A painting or drawing – miscellaneous—paintings that do not fit well into the other classes including still life (please state size)
60. Photography – People (max size 8”x6” including mount)
61. Photography – Animals (max size 8”x6” including mount)
62. Photography – Landscape (max size 8”x6” including mount)
63. Photography – Action (max size 8”x6” including mount)
64. Photography – Flowers/Gardens (max size 8”x6” including mount)
